

Have you ever wondered what the *El Niño* weather pattern is? El Niño is a weather pattern where higher than average sea surface temperatures develop across the east-central equatorial pacific. Traditionally, El Niño brings with it, warm, dry weather, more extreme temperature events and the increased risk of bushfires and droughts to Victoria. Australian climate scientist have predicted that there is a 70% chance of El Niño developing in 2023.








What's Happening in the garden?
