The school has had an amazing start to Term 1.

We warmly welcome all new students and families to Cranbourne Park, we hope this school becomes home for many years.

Many of you will have noticed the construction work that has started along the gym, facing the oval. This work has been a project for the last 18 months and now finally, we are seeing completion not too far ahead.

The project was started with a small grant from the Department of Education to extend outdoor learning spaces and shade for students at yard times. The project covers $6m \times 48m$ along the length of the gym with a concrete base enabling use all year round.

We look forward to the work being finished and ask that parents and students keep away from the area to ensure everyone's safety.

What's Happening in 2D

This week in Maths, 2D have been practicing skip counting by 2s, 5s and 10s. For students wanting to challenge themselves, they could skip count starting at any number, or could skip count backwards. 2D then took their learning outside, where students worked in groups to draw a hopscotch grid, then numbered the squares in their chosen skip counting pattern. Students then took turns hopping through the various grids, identifying the skip counting pattern/rule as they went. Well done 2D!




