From the Principal's Office...

This week, we welcomed back our students from the holidays. It was exciting having the students share their holiday stories. We enjoyed hearing about a wide range of experiences, from overseas holidays to watching their new "favourite" movie.

The students have jumped back into their learning, with our structured literacy and numeracy programs beginning from the first day of term. We strongly encourage families to continue, or begin, their home reading routines to ensure daily reading takes place as well as supporting the students to be at school, on time, every day.

This term, we say goodbye to three of our staff members. Mrs Jade Douma who was running the intervention program has taken up a teaching position closer to home. This will save Jade almost two hours a day in travel time. Mrs Monica Edwards will also be leaving us, taking up a position in the Police Force Academy and due to unforeseen circumstances, Miss Naomi Liang will be taking leave for the remainder of the year. We hope you will join us in thanking them for all their hard work over the years. We wish them the best of luck.

Families may have recently heard in the news that additional funding has been allocated by the government to help schools manage the cost of camps. Although the additional funding doesn't cover all the increased costs, we are hopeful that it is enough to run camps in 2024 and beyond. Early estimates have a 3-day camp coming in at around \$375 and a 4-day camp at around \$450. We are still in the very early stages and will look at ways to reduce the cost, however, if you are interested in a 2024 camp it might help to start putting money aside now. More information will come out in the future.

In some exciting news, we have started the process for the \$1.9m redevelopment of the oval. We have been meeting with the VSBA (Victorian Schools Building Authority) and various architects to get the ball rolling on the design and then construction of our oval.

Friday Lunch Orders

Are you thinking of having a lunch order on Friday?
There are some simple steps to placing an order:

1. Write your name and class on a lunch order bag or envelope (If order is in an envelope include and extra 20 cents for a lunch order bag)
2. Note down the items you would like to order along with the price per item.
3. Add the prices up and write down the total on the lunch bag or envelope.
4. Put the money in the bag/envelope or pay by Eftpos at the school office
5. Hand your lunch order in at the office when you arrive at school

If you cannot hand it in on Lunch Order day, please hand it in the day before.
