Ms Hutchins confirmed the allocation of \$1.9million to be used towards rebuilding the school oval including a running track, long jump pit, playground for students and dedicated areas for soccer. football and basketball.

The school is excited to see this development start and look forward to the next project to work towards.

It was my absolute pleasure to also acknowledge, in front of the Minister and local MP Pauline Richards, the gratitude and appreciation Mr Youngs and I have for our staff and wider community. Over the past three years, there has been a tremendous change filter throughout the school and these changes continue to deliver great results. Friday Lunch Orders

Are you thinking of having a lunch order on Friday? There are some simple steps to placing an order:

- 1. Write your name and class on a lunch order bag or envelope (If order is in an envelope include and extra 20 cents for a lunch order bag)
- 2. Note down the items you would like to order along with the price per item.
- 3. Add the prices up and write down the total on the lunch bag or envelope.
- 4. Put the money in the bag/envelope or pay by Eftpos at the school office
- 5. Hand your lunch order in at the office when you arrive at school

If you cannot hand it in on Lunch Order day, please hand it in the day before.



Detox your Home is coming to Berwick!

Safely dispose of unwanted household chemicals at a free Detox your Home event, without harming your health or the environment.

Household chemicals such as bleach, pesticides, weed killers, cleaning products, cosmetics, and cooking oil should never be put in your rubbish bins or poured down the drain.

Detox your Home events are drive-through and contactless.

Why dispose of household chemicals?

Household chemicals can be dangerous. They may harm your family and pets, add extra fuel to a house fire, release toxic fumes and pollute the environment.

Disposing of these items responsibly will:

- reduce the risk of poisoning, keeping your family, friends and pets safe
- · keep toxic chemicals out of waterways, and
- minimise environmental pollution and fire hazards.

What happens to the chemicals?

Qualified chemists sort the chemicals, placing them in sealed drums to be transported to a specialist waste treatment plant. The majority of chemicals collected at Detox your Home events are recycled or used for suitable purposes, such as producing energy. Any chemicals that cannot be repurposed are safely disposed of after being treated.



Detox your Home accepts:

Acids and alkalis

Aerosol cans

Ammonia based cleaners

Anti-freeze, coolant

Brake flui

Car body filler

Car care products and waxes

Cooking oil

Cosmetics, nail polish and remover

Detergents, bleach, disinfectants and drain cleaner

Fertilisers

Fire extinguishers

Floor-care products and waxes

Fuels: petrol, diesel, kerosene, other

Glues: water-based and solvents

Hand sanitiser

Herbicides and weed killers

Insect spray and pesticides incl. rat poison

Oven cleaner

Pool chemicals

Solvents

Thinners, turps and paint stripper

Transmission fluid

Wood preservatives and finishes

For safety reasons we can't accept containers of more than 20 litres or 20 kilograms. Please bring chemicals in their original packaging or in disposable containers that will not be returned to you.


