Welcome to the 2024 school year! It has been wonderful seeing everyone return with excitement and smiles. We would like to extend a warm welcome to our new families as they join the Cranbourne Park Community. This year we have several new staff members joining us as our school expands with two additional classes (Prep and Year 4) as well as a staffing boost to our intervention program. Please find further information about our new staff further into the newsletter.

We have started the year with some fantastic data sent to us by the Department of Education. They have analysed NAPLAN growth for our students that sat NAPLAN in both Year 3 and Year 5. Over the two years our students significantly outperformed "similar" and "network" schools (those schools in our area) and also outperformed the state average, a huge achievement!

Specifically, 28% of our Year 5 students had high growth in reading, compared to 20% in similar schools and 25% for the state. In numeracy, 34% of our students had high growth compared to 17% in similar schools and 25% in state. We are incredibly proud of the effort our students, families and staff put into the education of the students at CPPS.

We are fortunate that we still have some limited space for new enrolments across selected year levels. 

Friday Lunch Orders

Are you thinking of having a lunch order on Friday? There are some simple steps to placing an order:

- 1. Write your name and class on a lunch order bag.

- 3. Add the prices up and write down the total on the lunch bag or envelope.
- 4. Put the money in the bag/envelope or pay by Eftpos at the school office.
- 5. Hand your lunch order in at the office when you arrive at school.
